September 2022 was a month like no other! We were all shocked to hear of the death of HM Queen Elizabeth II on Thursday 8th September. For the next ten days, we were gripped by the procedures and paraphernalia of mourning the Queen, culminating in her state funeral on Monday 19th September. We feel bereft, as if our one source of constancy in an ever-changing world has been torn away from us. But I trust that you're aware, as the Queen herself reminded us each Christmas, that the only true source of constancy in this world is God himself. I trust you're aware that it was her reliance on God's strength and grace which enabled the Queen to carry out her role faithfully, with such good humour and kindness, throughout the 70 years of her reign. And I hope that when you're talking to your family and friends, you take the opportunity to say that God offers his strength and grace to each one of us who, like the Queen, accepts his offer of forgiveness, and offers up our life to him in grateful praise. What's the best news you've ever heard? is a question which is asked in the first session of Christianity Explored.
